FLAG SIZES FOR RESIDENTIAL HOUSE MOUNTED FLAGPOLES

Flag poles are typically 5 ft. or 6 ft., suitable for a 2 % x 4 ft. banner or 3 x 5 ft. flag. Tangle free rotating flagpoles are best suited to keep the flag from wrapping around the pole. Flagpole brackets are available in cast aluminum, adjustable aluminum and polished brass.
