FLAG SIZES FOR GROUND MOUNTED FLAGPOLES

Recommended flag length is between 1/4 and 1/3 the height of your flagpole.

15 ft.	3x5 ft.
20 ft.	4x6 ft.
25 ft.	5x8 ft.
30 ft.	6x10 ft.
40 ft.	8x12 ft.
50 ft.	10x15 ft.
60 ft.	12x18 ft.
70 ft.	15x25 ft.
80 ft.	20x30 ft.
100 ft.	20x38 ft.

FLAG SIZES FOR RESIDENTIAL HOUSE MOUNTED FLAGPOLES

Flag poles are typically 5 ft. or 6 ft., suitable for a 2 ½ x 4 ft. banner or 3 x 5 ft. flag.

Tangle free rotating flagpoles are best suited to keep the flag from wrapping around the pole.

Flagpole brackets are available in cast aluminum, adjustable aluminum and polished brass.

UNITED STATES FLAG DISPLAY

When carried in procession with other flags the U.S. flag should be either on the marching right (the flag

When displayed either horizontally or vertically against a wall, the union should be uppermost and to th

When displayed in a window, the flag should be displayed in the same way, with the union or blue field

The flag should not be displayed on a float in a parade except from a staff. It should not be draped over

The flag should not be carried flat or horizontally, but always aloft and free.

When displayed with another flag against a wall from crossed staffs, the U.S. flag should be on its own r

When flags of two or more nations are displayed, they should be flown from separate staffs of the same

When flags of states, cities or organizations are flown on the same staff, the U.S. flag should be at the t

When displayed with the flags of states of the union or municipalities and not with the flags of other na

The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroye
